The Greatest Gift for our Residents – 2007 ends with over 286 acres preserved!

The month of December is filled with the excitement of holidays and gift-giving. This past December, many of your neighbors, friends, and fellow Township residents have given each of us a present that will last forever: protected open space.



Longtime Charlestown residents Bob and Mary Ellen Joos donated a conservation easement on 79 acres along Church Road. Containing woodlands, waters of the Pickering Creek, rolling pastures and a historic farmhouse, the Joos property provides many scenic and environmental rewards.

The Koenig-Marulli family has donated a conservation easement on the Buckwalter Farm lands. This lovely 3.5 acre property contains not only the historic farmhouse of Mr. Samuel Buckwalter but also peaceful woodlands through which tributaries of the Pickering Creek flow.

Tom and Joanne Fillippo have donated a conservation easement on over 50 acres on Mine Road. Bucolic "Mine Run Farm" contains historic buildings, a tributary of the Pickering Creek, ponds, and over 25 acres of woodlands.

George and Susan Bullard have preserved historic Spring Lane Farm, on Hollow Road by placing a conservation easement on their land. 38 acres surround a beautiful Oakie house, with majestic sycamore trees lining the driveway. The Horse-Shoe Trail which traverses their property, will provide residents with leisure time for hiking and horseback riding alike.

The McDevitt family has preserved over 92 acres. Historic Hillsover Farm on Conestoga Road surrounds the waters of the Pickering, supports nearly 60 acres of woodlands, and will provide residents with two trails for horseback riding or hiking, as well as nature study and birdwatching areas.

Finally, the Kling family has preserved nearly 62 acres on Pikeland Road. This gorgeous property is nestled in the valley below the twin churches and sits near the already preserved Valhalla Farm and Joos property. Since it can be seen from many locations throughout the Township, the Kling farm's preservation adds an important piece to the viewshed! Once connecting trails have been established, residents will be able to enjoy hiking and horseback riding as well.

As your Open Space Director, I am thrilled to welcome the above residents to the ever-growing extended "family" of visionaries who love the land and whose generosity will serve us all for generations to come. Your Township thanks you.

Tax Information

All Township Taxes are collected by the Central Tax Agency, "Centax".

Earned Income Tax

Charlestown Township has a ½% Earned Income Tax. Since it was first imposed in 2004, all EIT funds that have been spent were used for open space acquisition and open space improvement. The Board of Supervisors passed a resolution in January of this year to do the same with the 2008 proceeds.

You're required to file an annual tax return for 2007 by April 15, 2008. For retirees and others with no earned income, we recommend that you return the form stating that you had no earned income, then sign your form.

The Central Tax Bureau is our Earned Income Tax Collector. If you have a question or need forms sent to you, please call them at 570-822-0555 or 610-497-6030.

Local Services Tax

This \$10.00 tax is deducted from the first paycheck of the year from those who are employed in Charlestown Township. Their employers are responsible for making this deduction and filing the appropriate forms, LST-1 and LST-2. Real Estate and Per Capita Taxes

Your real estate and per capita taxes for 2008 are collected by the Central Tax Bureau. Tax bills were mailed the week of February 1st to the property owner's address of record. Please check the address on your tax bill. These bills are printed with the address on record with the Chester County Assessment Office. If your address is incorrect, you are the only one authorized to correct it by sending a letter to:

Charlestown Township Seeks Volunteers for Spring Roadside Clean-up April 19, 2008

Last year the Board continued to sponsor an Earth Day clean up event. We were pleased and gratified at the level of participation we experienced and vowed to continue our efforts in 2008. So for this April, the Board of Supervisors seeks volunteers to help organize and undertake a clean-up of the township roads on April 19th.

We would love to have involvement from the business community, scouting and other organizations. Safer, off-road tasks can be planned for younger children. The Township will provide trash bags, gloves, and safety vests for volunteers.

Volunteers will start from the Township office fortified with a continental breakfast before going out onto the roads. If you are not available on April 19th but still wish to participate on a different day, contact the Township Office to obtain supplies and safety instructions.

There are many ways you can participate. We need people in the following roles:

<u>Organizers:</u>


- Assign a road captain to each township road who will organize his/her crew.
- Arrange with the Township staff to obtain trash bags and safety vests for the volunteers.
- Arrange for orange cones and possible temporary road closings with the Roadmaster for dangerous areas.

Road Captains:

- Be in charge of a specific road in the Township and organize his/her crew.
- Direct litter clean-up on Clean up Day using Township supplied materials.

Crew Volunteers:

- Pick up litter along your assigned road using township provided supplies.
- Filled bags may be left at the side of the road for the Township and PennDOT crews to pick up later.

General Instructions:

Do not mix Materials. Bring all substances in original containers with labels. <u>Items must be identifiable</u>. Tighten lids on all containers. If containers are leaking, pack in larger container with newspaper to soak up leaks.

What is Acceptable:

<u>Paint Products</u>: Turpentine, Wallpaper Cement, Paint Thinners, Strippers & Removers, Oil-Based Paints, Stains, Varnish, Shellac, Other Solvent Based Paint Products

<u>Outdoor Products</u>: Swimming Pool Chemicals, Weed Killers, Septic Tank Degreasers, Asphalt Sealers, Caulking Compounds, Joint Compound, Roof Cements

<u>Automotive Products</u>: Grease & Rust Solvents, Fuel Additives, Carburetor Cleaners, Transmission/Brake Fluid, Antifreeze, Gasoline

<u>Household Products</u>: Drain Openers, Rug Cleaners, Wood & Metal Cleaners, Toilet Bowl Cleaners, Adhesives/Solvents, Mothballs/Flakes, Spot Removers, Dry Cleaning Fluid, Household Batteries, Kerosene, Smoke Alarms

<u>Other</u>: Acids, Caustics, Solvents, Flammables, Oxidizers, Reactives, Organic Peroxide, Reactive Metals, Lead, Pesticides, Mercury Bearing Items, Gas Cylinders 20 lbs or less, Asbestos

The following materials will <u>NOT BE ACCEPTED</u>:

- Car Batteries, Dioxin, Latex (Water Based) Paint, Used Motor Oil, Explosives & Ammunition, Appliances, Infectious or Medical Waste, Radioactive Waste, Unidentified Waste, Pressurized CFC's & HCFS's, Tires.
- Latex Paint is NOT Toxic. To dispose of Latex Paint, air dry or absorb latex paint with kitty litter or other absorbent, then dispose of in your regular trash.
- Recycle motor oil, car batteries, tires and anti-freeze at your local service station.
